

PE and sport

PE and sport is at the heart of our school values and is taught across school.

Our school believes that sport is at the very heart of a child's development. As well as contributing to the raising of academic attainment, we believe sport teaches children the following qualities:

- Positivity
- Healthy Lifestyles
- Teamwork
- Resilience
- Responsibility
- Reflectiveness
- The ability to accept triumph and disappointment both the same
...and most importantly
- Enjoy being active/having fun

Our PE co-ordinator has developed core provision through school and supports all staff. Our PE curriculum is broad and balanced. Games lessons are sport specific and include football, hockey, tag rugby, netball, athletics, tennis, badminton and netball. Well-planned lessons provide the progression required to develop skills in gymnastics and dance. All the children receive a minimum of two hours of timetabled PE each week.

Staff are regularly able to improve their knowledge and skills in PE and sport by attending training held throughout the year. The staff have observed skilled colleagues in the teaching of different aspects of PE and sport. Lesson observations show that staff are capable of delivering high quality PE lessons. Children are engaged, motivated and demonstrate a high level of skills during the lessons.

All children are able to access our PE curriculum. Children represent our school at a local level and sometimes district level. Achievements out of school are celebrated on our display board in the sports hall and are shared with the whole school community each week in our special assembly. Mini Leaders play a significant role in introducing and involving our youngest children to sports activities at dinner times.

We operate a house system, where children take part in competitive fixtures throughout the year in sports such as kwik cricket, swimming, football, rounders, sports hall athletics etc. Sports day is held at the Sheffield Institute of Sport to inspire the children and let them experience what it is like to perform at a high quality sporting facility.

Academic Year 2013/14:

- 93 children collectively attended sports related after school clubs.
- 27 children have taken part in sport fixtures with other schools.
- 2 children are part of the shooting star gifted and talented programme with our School Sports Partnership.
- Sainsbury's School Games Silver Award 2013 2014
- This year we started school competitions with our house teams. This will involve all children in school.

Before and after school clubs of football, table tennis, rugby, running, futsal, street dance, netball and cross country have so far involved 93 children.

2014/2015 - School Sports Premium funding for 2014 2015 was £8,380

Last year saw us expanding our programme of improving Fundamental Movement Skills within our Foundation Stage and Infant Phases.

Sporting achievements during Academic Year 2014/15:

- 114 children collectively attended sports related after school clubs.
- 24 children have taken part in sport fixtures with other schools.
- 3 children are part of the Shooting Stars gifted and talented programme with our north East Derbyshire School Sports Partnership.
- The school water polo team were cup runners up after winning the League the year before.
- The girls' football team won the Eckington JFC schools tournament.
- Three children were identified by the local table tennis club as having the outstanding potential in table tennis with one child already achieving his Bronze Silver and Gold Awards as well as his bronze umpiring award.
- The school's annual Sports Day held at Sheffield Institute of Sport identified a number of talented Key Stage 1 athletes that will be supported in further athletic development during the next academic year.

After school clubs of football, table tennis, netball, gymnastics, badminton, water polo and skills & games involved 114 children.

We have an extensive range of high quality equipment available for all of the children for all of the sports that we teach. It is important that the children have access to age appropriate equipment.

The School Sports Funding has been used to enhance what is already a huge commitment to sport and PE:

- Qualified coaches from Sheffield Wednesday F.C, Sheffield United F.C as well as Derbyshire School Sport Partnership, are working with and alongside teachers in lessons. The coach enables smaller group work to be organised in order to develop even further the skills of all of the children.
- Lunchtime clubs of football and basketball are organised twice a week increasing pupil participation in structured activities.
- Affiliation to the North East Derbyshire School Sports Partnership for the next two years. (The schools' Headteacher is the Eckington Cluster Primary Headteacher representative on the management committee for NEDSSP.
- Provide additional after-school clubs in order to increase the number of children participating.

The school is still investing heavily in developing Fundamental Movement Skills across all year groups with all children receiving 15 minutes ABCs (Agility- Balance- Coordination- Speed) work during each PE lesson. We strongly believe that by developing the children's agility, balance, coordination and speed it will help them to perform better in all sporting activities they take part in.

Programmes such as "Physical Literacy" and "Every Child A Mover" (ECAM) are initiated in the early stages of Foundation 1 and Foundation 2 to support physical development but are also used as intervention strategies for older children also in order to develop other curriculum areas.

The school enjoys strong partnerships with nine times Paralympic Swimming Champion Martin Mansel who supports the school with its commitment to Inclusive PE.

We are proud to have strong links with local resident and former Winter Olympic Athlete Nicola Minichiello who helps with athletics coaching.

The school is committed to developing:

- Talented and Gifted children in sports and athletics
- Targeted activities for non-participatory children including Pupil Premium and other disadvantaged children.
- Healthy Lifestyles
- Competitive Sport

School Sports Premium funding for 2015 2016 is expected to be £8,705.

In 2015 2016 the school is looking to reach its target of the Gold Sainsbury's School Games Award.
